








DAVID S. - STAR TRAYS

David's three images are destined to became trays. A sign of a true craftsman, when every centre of each star is lined up perfectly.


JACOB S. -BASEBALL PLAQUES

The Maple cuts well but the Rosewood doesn't want to cut, it doesn't want to hold the details and it's tough as steel. Using the scroll saw was definitely a good choice.



I was able to buy an old Poitras, it had been abandoned for years. It was cheap, all the accessories (cutter heads, cutter knives, spindle wrenches) had been lost over the years. I've managed to replace the missing things. The motor was taken apart and cleaned. I reassembled it and attached it back to the base. I'm currently working on the column with the height adjustment and spindle bearings in it. So far I've been able to resolve all the problems created by the previous owners and I'm enjoying the restoration.


