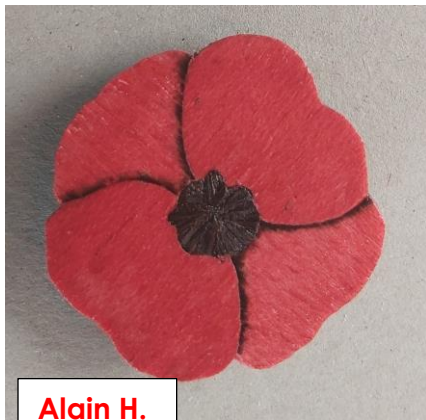

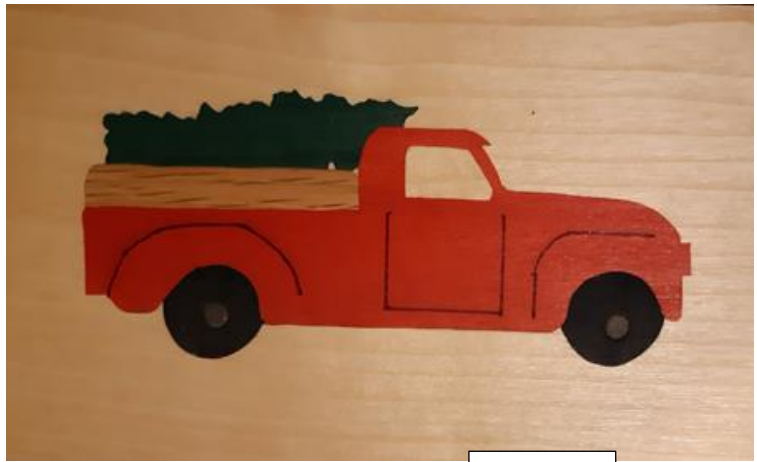

JOHN S. – TABLE RESTORATION, CIRCA 1850-70 TABLE

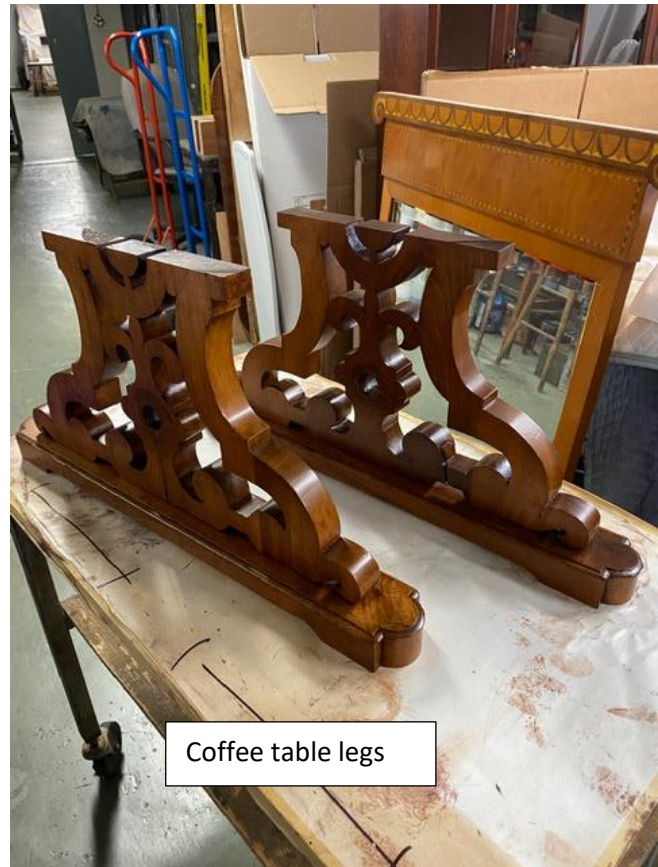


The before picture with the postit notes show the many areas where veneer was either missing, damaged, lifting or showed attempts by others to repair.

SAMANTHA S. – JEWELRY BOXES ...



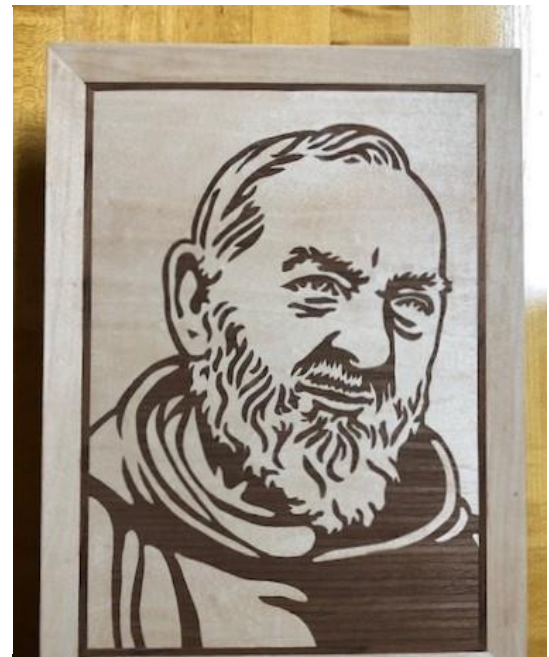
Here are some of the marquetry items I've made in the last few months. All of these items were made using a laser cutter for both the items (boxes and coasters) and the marquetry.

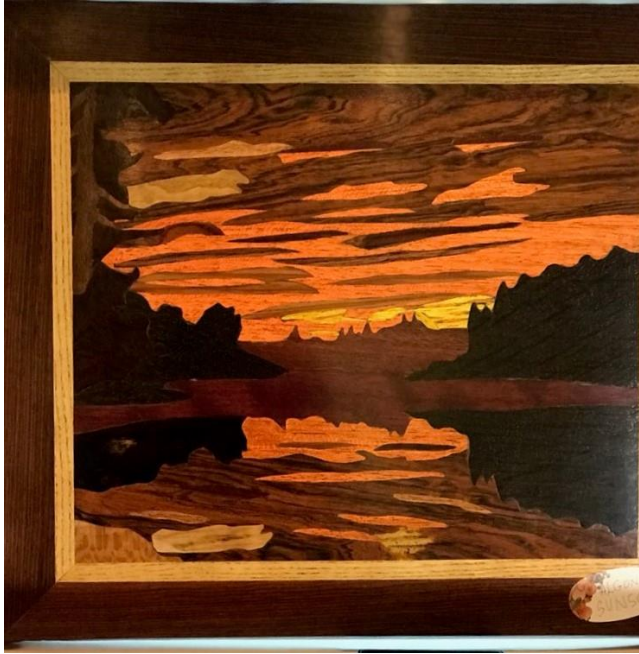

Cardinal bookmark. The branch and snow were drawn by hand. I sanded some black veneer and rubbed the dust into part of the red to try and give the cardinal some depth.



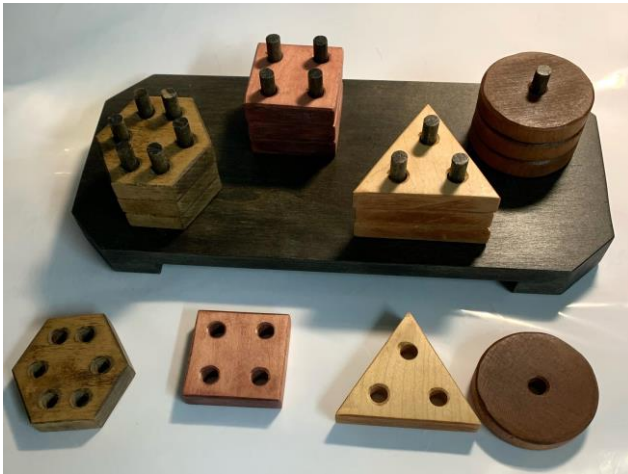
Toy box built by me and painted by my daughter and friend. The back panel is painted with chalkboard paint.



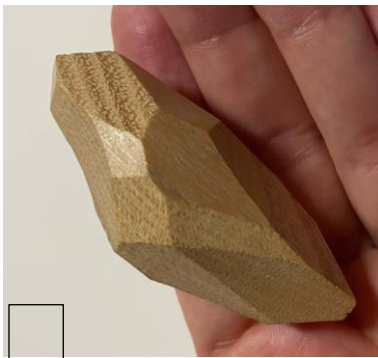
Restored jewelry box

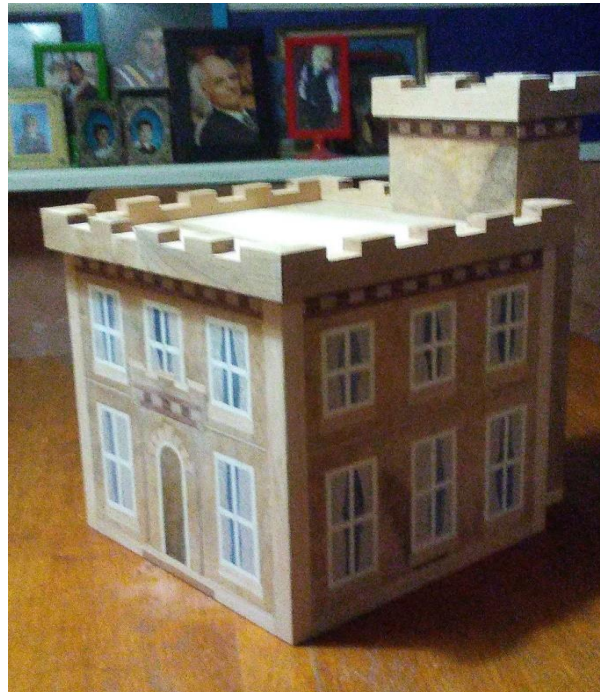
I've taught myself how to cane and have done 6 of these little antique dining chairs for a friend. I'm weaving the caning so each chair has taken about 6 hours!
